Vestry Update

In March the Vestry accomplished quite a bit as we continued to handle a wide range of issues and tasks. One big task was to complete and submit the annual Parochial Report, which is now done!

A significant decision made at the March meeting was to allocate our 2023 Outreach funds (\$7864) in this manner:

Columbus House meals: \$500

Canopy for community outreach: \$300 Wallingford Community Dinners: \$200

El Porvenir: \$2000

IRIS: \$2000

Episcopal Relief and Development: \$2000

Camp Washington: \$864

A subcommittee comprised of Amy Foster, Carole Ireland, and Nathalie Szilagyi developed the above proposal that the Vestry approved. This group will be joined by Nathan Leach and two additional parishioners to work on plans for allocating the 2024 Outreach funds.

The Vestry also approved a proposal created by Carole Ireland and Wendy Oestreicher to restructure and increase our suggested donations for outside use of our facilities. We continue to discuss ways to advertise the availability of this space to non-profits.

Additional items that we are continuing to work on include getting nametags on lanyards for all parishioners, developing a prayer for the search process for a new priest, and some property items.

Finally, we are grateful to Sharon Turlis and Wendy Oestreicher who have volunteered to co-chair the Memorial Garden Committee. Rob Page has been a wonderful leader of this committee for many years, and we appreciate not only the work he has put into it but also his offer to help train the new leadership.


