

Dwelling in the Word

Luke 24: 27-35

27...beginning with Moses and all the prophets, Jesus interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures. 28As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. 29But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them. 30When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. 31Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. 32They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" 33That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. 34They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" 35Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

Where is the Spirit moving your heart as you hear the scripture read?

1. **Read the scripture.** Underline any words or phrases that pop out at you, pique your imagination, or capture you for any reason.

2. **Sit in silence.**

a. What caught your imagination?

b. What resonates or touches you personally? c. Why?

d. Be open to let God speak to you – you might be surprised.

3. **Find a “reasonably friendly-looking stranger.”** Or at least someone you don’t normally sit with!

4. **Listen** that person into their truth of what God is saying to them through this scripture today. Prompt them. Listen carefully.

5. **Switch roles.**
