## **Vestry Update**

This December the Vestry has continued to work on addressing the financial challenges facing the parish and developing ways to implement the recommendations of the Financial Sustainability Task Force. There are subgroups of the Vestry paying special attention to the recommendations regarding moving to part-time clergy, restructuring our endowments, and potential increases to the fee structure for rental of our space. We will be sharing our work with the parish soon along with a proposed budget for 2023. Look for written material coming in January, and plan to attend a special Q & A opportunity with parish officers on <u>Sunday, January 15 after both services</u>. Please note that we are offering this after both services to make it easy for all parishioners to engage.

## St. Paul's Stewardship Campaign

We are very appreciative of everyone who made their pledge for 2023 thus far and happy to report as of this writing, more online pledging was still happening. Hard copies of the pledge form are also available at the church.

Our pledge campaign *More Than Enough*, this year focuses on the miracle of sharing, the ways in which our means meet the needs of the world, the ways in which we respond to the Gospel, the ways in which we sustain our community. 

## **Holiday for Giving**

The sun was shining, but the wind was blowing, and Pat, Art and Sharon were bundled up in the parking lot for our last drive of the year – it was too cold for our little mascot Bowie, so he stayed home. The last food and diaper drive of 2022 ended with our collection 328 lbs of food and \$85 in cash donations for Master's Manna and \$105 for diapers for the Community Day Care. our Holiday for Giving campaign collected over 150 toys for children in our community. We had a successful year, with a total collection of just shy of 4,000 lbs of food and \$1,440 in cash donations for Master's Manna, \$1,310 in cash donations for diapers, along with many packages of diapers and wipes, and three carloads of toys taken to the Holiday for Giving distribution center. We couldn't have done it without the generosity of everyone who drove thru our parking lot on the second Saturday of the month and popped their trunks filled with food. A special thank you from Sharon, Pat, Art and MaryEllen to everyone who gave so generously throughout the year. This was our last drive for 2022 – we hope to be back in the parking lot in the spring – but keep your eye out for a special event on "Souper" Bowl Sunday!
